**Evangelism Workshop** – Witnessing is the purpose of your everyday life. The Every One His Witness® Lutheran evangelism program considers the real world context in which Lutherans find themselves as witnesses of Jesus Christ. It puts sound doctrine into practical action for sharing the faith with the people whom God has placed alongside His witnesses in their everyday lives. This workshop will be reviewing the principles we learned last year with an opportunity to share experiences. The workshop will be in the Fellowship Hall on Saturday, August 20<sup>th</sup> from 8am to around 1pm. A light breakfast and lunch will be provided.
