What Is the Value of Going to Church? Lutherans and the Third Commandment.

Have you lost all interest in going to church? Do you feel like you may be starting down that path? If you answered "no" to both of these questions, then this brief article will hopefully help in keeping your answer that way. If your answer was "yes" to those questions, then let this serve as a gentle reminder that church on Sunday (or Wednesday) is the place where God promises to meet you with his gifts of forgiveness, eternal life, and salvation. Yes, you have already received those gifts in Baptism. But, you and I continue to sin every day and are in constant need of reminders of those gifts and continued reception of those gifts. In the Small Catechism, Martin Lutheran ends his "Christian Questions with Their Answers" section by addressing the concern that a Christian may not feel a need for the Lord's Supper. Those questions apply, in general, to attending the Divine Service as well, the only place a Christian can receive that sacred meal.

Here are those questions of Luther:

- 18. *Finally, why do you wish to go to the Sacrament?* That I may learn to believe that Christ, out of great love, died for my sin, and also learn from Him to love God and my neighbor.
- 19. What should admonish and encourage a Christian to receive the Sacrament frequently? First, both the command and the promise of Christ the Lord. Second, his own pressing need, because of which the command, encouragement, and promise are given.
- 20. But what should you do if you are not aware of this need and have no hunger and thirst for the Sacrament? To such a person no better advice can be given than this: first, he should touch his body to see if he still has flesh and blood. Then he should believe what the Scriptures say of it in Galatians 5 and Romans 7. Second, he should look around to see whether he is still in the world, and remember that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say in John 15–16 and in 1 John 2 and 5. Third, he will certainly have the devil also around him, who with his lying and murdering day and night will let him have no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in John 8 and 16; 1 Peter 5; Ephesians 6; and 2 Timothy 2.

On the seventh day of creation, God rested from his work (Genesis 2:1–3). He who is infinite in power and might does not ever lose any energy and does not ever get tired. His resting was for our benefit. You and I are built to work, with God giving us many vocations to fulfill every day (Ephesians 2:10). There is also a need for rest. Just as our bodies need sleep and rest from work, so our souls need rest from this sinful world (Matthew 11:28). That idea of resting on a sabbath day was set in stone when God gave the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy" (Exodus 20:8–11).

Keeping something holy or sacred means that we need to hold it in high regard. That does take a conscious effort. Even an expensive gold ring can be neglected and forgotten. But God has enshrined the gift of rest in the Third Commandment. Jesus explained that the Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath (Mark 2:27). We are not to worship the Sabbath, but use it to our advantage.

Luther explains: "We are to fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and God's Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it." The Third Commandment remains in place for us as the people of God to go to where the Word of God is preached and where we can rightly learn it. That place God has created and preserved as the church. Luther's explanation of the Third Commandment also means that we should spend time hearing and studying the Word of God every day, praying everyday, and meditating on Christ's work for our salvation everyday.

What is the proper care and treatment of an expensive gold ring? It is to be cleaned up and shined up for its beauty to be rightly seen and enjoyed. Even more so the Third Commandment. We keep it holy by prioritizing the service of the church where God's grace is freely given. We hold the Word in high regard when we read the Scriptures and are taught the Word by those trained so to teach.

The Hebrew people were first given a command regarding the Sabbath when they were on their way to Sinai after being set free from slavery in Egypt (Exodus 16). God provided them bread from heaven every day, except on the Sabbath. They were not to work on the Sabbath then, so they could collect a double portion on the day before. Any preparation of the bread must be done before the Sabbath began. This command was given by God as a way for his redeemed people to show their willing obedience toward him.

Attending church and Bible class is a similar opportunity for us, to show our willing obedience to God for all that he has done for us. And, because we are receiving the gift of the Gospel in Word and Sacrament, going to church is no tedious, pointless task. It is not mindless obedience for the sake of obedience. This is God's gift to you and me for the assurance of our salvation in the midst of an ever-declining and corrupting world, ravaged by evil and sin and death.

God our heavenly Father longs for us to come to him for shelter and protection in this world. Jesus said, in Matthew 11, "Come to me all who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest." The Lord Jesus is our rest, our Sabbath. In him is plentiful redemption, for in him is the forgiveness of all our sin. Jesus Christ is the one who has died on the cross for us all. He has paid for our salvation with his own blood. He did it all out of love for you, for all the world (John 3:16). Christ Jesus considered it a joy to endure the cross and suffer its shame (Hebrews 12:2) because he knew it would bring you life and salvation and grant you rest in his kingdom forever.

What a blessing it is for us to gather together, to hear God's Word, and to call upon him in prayer and praise for all that he has done for us. Truly, such gathering is a foretaste of the fellowship and communion we will share forever (Revelation 4–5), even as the saints who have gone before us are gathered around Christ and his throne even now (Revelation 7:9).

You are all constantly in my prayers for renewed and sustained vigor in the one, true faith. Please pray the same for me and for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus.

The Lord bless you and keep you in his grace through his holy Word, held sacred by his Church to life everlasting.
