A Service of Comfort and Hope Christmas and the Theology of the Cross

“It’s the most wonderful time of the year,” Andy Williams sings in his most famous Christmas song. No doubt you have heard it a few times already this holiday season. And, for many people, the statement is true: it is the most wonderful time of the year. Yet, for many others, this time can be the most dreaded time of the year. Such feelings come from truly human experiences in a broken and sinful world. The death of a dearly missed loved one, severance from a much-needed job, or destruction of home and possessions can all dampen the ever-present “holiday spirit.”

And that is okay. No, it is not okay when loved ones die or jobs are lost or earthly goods are taken away. These things have been happening since Adam and Eve fell into sin and plunged the world in with them. And tragedies and sadness will continue until the Last Day, when Jesus Christ returns in all his glory to judge both the living and the dead. What is okay is the feelings that result because of them. Sadness and even depression are human reactions to tragic events. God has made us to be this way. Admitting to this sadness and depressed feeling is not a failure, but a victory. And feeling less than the “holiday spirit” makes no one any less of a Christian. God can even use those feelings and your experiences to strengthen your faith and renew your joy in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

In case you had not noticed before, the Bible is not always a “happy-to-read” kind of book. It follows the life events of human beings, after all, and they go through a plethora of tragedies. Imagine Adam and Eve’s own shock and depression of realizing that they are to blame for all of this world’s sin and corruption, for thousands of years to come, and for 900 more years of life before their own deaths would come to them. What pulled them through all those years? The promise of a savior, their savior from all sin (Genesis 3:15). Or, contemplate beloved Noah and all that he experienced. He was the man God called to build a barge large enough to hold two of every kind of animal that God had created. He endured the hateful speech and persecution of those observing his construction project, no doubt many from his own family adding salt to his wounds. And then to remember again and again for 300 more years the millions, if not billions, of sinners like him who had perished in the flood. What got Noah through it all? The promise that God would not destroy the world with a flood again (Genesis 9:8-17).

Many more stories like these can be found throughout the Bible, matching and often surpassing our own experiences. What rises above all of those realities found in this badly broken world is the continued love of God. He is patient with sinners. He makes promises to all mankind that this is not all they shall ever know: heartache and pain, sadness and despair. Word comes from God to his fully exiled people, as recorded in Isaiah 40: “Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD’s hand double for all her sins.” Imagine going through the most painful of all experiences in your life and hearing directly from God’s prophets this great word of comfort. God loves you. He cares for you. He knows everything that you are going through. Our good and gracious God never leaves you or forsakes you. He carries you through it all.

God’s memory never fails him. “He recalls his promises and leads his people forth in joy” we sing in the Post-Communion Canticle. And all of the promises God has ever made for comfort and joy for his people find their completion in Jesus Christ. Time and again, the Lord promised to bring his people a redeemer. He would be one from their own midst. “For a virgin will conceive and bear a son” (Isaiah 7:14). “For unto us a child is born, to us a son is given” (Isaiah 9:6).

When Jesus was born into this world at Christmas, that was a most historic moment. God in the flesh, Immanuel, had come to dwell with mankind. Jesus Christ, God’s own Son, suffered through the pains of this earthly life. He knew sickness and injury (Isaiah 53:3-4). He bore the heartache of his dear friend, Lazarus’s, death (John 11). Jesus hungered and thirsted. He bled and died, bearing the sin, the rebellion, the hatred of all mankind toward his Father in his own body on the cross. Going through all of those terrible things was not the end of it all. Three days following his death we arrive at Christ’s glorious resurrection. Jesus’ victory over sin and death, his triumphal resurrection from the dead, makes all that we endure in this life worth it.

“So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us

an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal” (2 Corinthians 4:16–18). Such words from the apostle Paul are not meant to remove sadness or to make light of it. But, rather, to give comfort in the midst of such situations. God’s Word of comfort to the Israelites did not end their exile, but it did give them the hope they needed to endure.

Such is the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ for us today. We live in a world of ongoing suffering and pain. Tragedies happen seemingly every day. And Jesus’ work of redemption on the cross certainly has not eliminated such suffering. Rather, Jesus’ gift of eternal life and salvation through the forgiveness of sins that he gives to those who believe in him grants comfort and hope in the presence of suffering and sadness. As Christians, then, we constantly turn to the Gospel and need to hear the Gospel, in moments of happiness and especially in moments of sadness.

We are blessed as the people of God to be able to join together as Christ’s family to hear his Word of comfort and hope, even as we approach the Christmas season, which may be difficult for some. If you find the celebration of Christmas and the surrounding holidays challenging to bear as a result of the deaths of loved ones or the loss of a job or for any other reason, then you are sincerely invited to join with others with similar feelings and experiences in a service of hope and comfort on Sunday, December 9 at 3pm in our sanctuary. Of course, all people are invited to attend this service for the hearing of specific words of comfort from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is in his suffering and death that we all find the full love of God for us, so that all may have peace in him.

The Lord bless you and keep you this holiday season in his grace and truth, knowing that Christ Jesus is with you every moment of your lives, now and forevermore.


