The Songs of Christmas...from the Bible Focus for Advent and Christmas

Have you ever had a song stuck in your head? Where did that song come from? You likely heard the song recently. Or the song was attached to a memory that called the tune back to your mind. What we experience of music is mostly what we have learned. Few are caught coming up with their own tunes or lyrics. But, what about our earliest ancestors? Did Adam and Eve know how to sing? Did Eve hum a lullaby to Cain as she rocked him to sleep? Was Noah chanting a tune while constructing the ark?

Of course, we cannot possibly know what the music was like thousands of years ago. The Bible does tell us that the great-great-great-grandson of Cain, whose name was Jubal, was the "father of all those who play the lyre and pipe" (Genesis 4:21). Instruments were made fairly early on in the world's history. It would not likely take long for words to be added to those tunes. Music and lyrics would become a common way of giving thanks and praise to God, as is demonstrated in the ancient hymn book of the Israelites we know well as the book of Psalms.

Without the ability to record music, the only trace of songs from the past would be the instruments and the words written for the songs. As is typical of songs today, the songs of the past were written in poetic form. When one finds poetry in ancient literature, a safe assumption would be that those words were often put to music. That is what we can find throughout the Bible, the genre of poetry that would likely be put to music and thus be called songs. The poetic nature of songs would be why certain portions of the Bible have been designated as songs, such as the song of Moses (Exodus 15:1–18), the song of Deborah and Barak (Judges 5:1–31), Hannah's song (1 Samuel 2:1–10), and the Song of Solomon (Song of Songs 1–8).

Knowing that Biblical figures have utilized songs as part of their lives and worship, it is only natural that the story of Jesus' birth would spark so many songs and hymns. The most famous of those come from the Bible itself. This Advent season, we will explore the songs that are directly inspired by the events surrounding Jesus' birth. These songs will call from the past the prophecies of the Biblical ancients and we shall see anew how the Lord God fulfills his greatest promise of them all, to send his only-begotten Son to us for our salvation. The birth of Jesus Christ is truly worthy of unlimited songs, and the ones recorded in the Bible are the best of them all.

The songs that will be visited are:

The Song of Mary, also known as the Magnificat (Luke 1:46–55);

The Song of Zechariah, also known as the Benedictus (Luke 1:67–80);

The Song of Simeon, also known as the Nunc Dimittis (Luke 2:29–32); and

The Song of the Angels, also known as the Gloria in Excelsis (Luke 2:14).

We are blessed to have received the liturgy of the church handed down throughout the centuries, for included in those liturgical services are those Christmas hymns and songs. We will enjoy variations of them throughout the Advent season as we anticipate with Mary, Zechariah, Simeon, the Angels, and all the people of God the glorious incarnation and birth of the Son of God, our Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that you are able to join us regularly throughout this season of preparation as we fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:1). As we well know from other times of preparation, when the work is done, the celebration can begin and can be enjoyed. So it is with the joyous festival of Christmas!




