The Advent Wreath History and Understanding

Another church year has begun with the season of Advent, a time of preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord. The sanctuary has been decorated and the season's color of blue dominates the altar. With the Christmas tree and the Nativity scene on display comes the presence of the Advent wreath. The Advent wreath stands next to the lectern in our sanctuary and is used to mark the weeks of the season.

Use of candles to track the time of Advent date back to the years just prior to the Reformation in the 1500s and originate in eastern Germany. There are typically four candles that are used to represent the four Sundays in Advent. Traditionally, Advent begins on the Sunday closest to the celebration of St. Andrew's day, which is November 30. The last Sunday in Advent is the Sunday that occurs before Christmas Day.

In the past, the color for Advent's season has been purple, as a correlation to the other preparatory church year season which is Lent. Blue has been used more prominently in recent history to help distinguish the two seasons. The word "Advent" means coming and the various comings of Christ are emphasized: his birth, the Means of Grace, and the Last Day. As all of these give hope for the Christian, the color blue is said to represent that promising emotion.

Advent wreaths are often decked with greenery to remind worshippers of the liveliness of faith in Christ. Most Advent wreaths will use color of the season, whether blue or purple. Some may be seen using white candles only. Those with blue or purple candles may also contain a pink or rose-colored candle. This candle is to be lit on the third Sunday in Advent (not the fourth) to reflect the more joyful theme illustrated in the opening word of the Introit for the day, which is "rejoice," or *Gaudete* in Latin.

Normally at the center of the Advent wreath will be a singular white candle. This is reserved for lighting at the Christmas Eve services, on Christmas Day, and for all other services in the twelve day season of Christmas.

There is no set order for which Advent candles are to be lit. What is to be followed is that one candle is lit on the First Sunday in Advent, two candles are lit on the Second Sunday in Advent, and so on. We have opted to follow the progression of moving upward toward the climax of the season as we have an angled Advent wreath. The bottom candle is lit first and the top candle lit last, when the Fourth Sunday in Advent arrives. We have designated the left-side candle as the second candle and the right-side candle as the third candle.

The overall purpose of the Advent wreath is to mark the Sundays in Advent in preparation for the celebration of Christmas. As each passing day builds the excitement of the return of Christ Jesus, so each passing week in Advent builds the excitement of Christ's coming at Christmas. Candles have always been used in the church as continuation of the candles used in the Old Testament tabernacle and temple. Christians are taught that Jesus Christ is the light of the world, as John writes in his Gospel's first chapter. Our candles always serve to remind us of the great truth that Jesus Christ always shines, even in the darkness of our fallen world.

I pray that you are able to join us for this great season of preparation and especially for the celebration of the feast of our Lord's nativity as we worship our Savior and King, which is good and right so to do! Please find a schedule of key events printed below for your convenience. The Lord's blessings to you and your family throughout this blessed holy season!

December Music Notes



As we make our way through Advent, I am reminded of just how much of our Lutheran musical heritage stems from the musical treasures of the Church in the centuries that preceded the Reformation.

Some of our hymns we regularly sing today are pretty much as Luther would have heard and sung them as a youngster and Priest, including:

LSB 351 Creator of the Stars of Night

LSB 357 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Many others are transliterations of Latin hymns, such as LSB 355. The Latin text (Rorate Coeli) is based in part on Isaiah 45:8 (Drop down, ye heavens from above, and let the skies reign down righteousness.) This serves as the Introit on the 4th Sunday of Advent in the Latin Rite. Our Prelude on December 22 will be based on the Latin chant, and we will sing the hymn, whose first verse is O Savior, rend the heavens wide; Come down, come down with mighty stride; Unlock the gates, the doors break down; Unbar the way to heaven's crown.

Among the most familiar of our Advent hymns is one of many which Luther himself translated and which we sing to a tune adapted by one of the first Lutheran composers, Johann Walter. The original text Veni, redemptor gentium dates from the 4th century, and is attributed to St. Ambrose. Luther brought this into our tradition as LSB 332 Savior of the Nations, Come. There will be special music for all of the Christmas Eve services and on Christmas morning as well!
