Living in the World, Without Becoming Like the World

“Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world – the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and the pride of life – is not from the Father, but is from the world. And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever.”

1 John 2:15-15

Not long before leaving this world, Jesus prayed to His heavenly Father for the faith of His twelve disciples and for all of us as His future followers saying, “I have given them Your Word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask you to take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one.” John 17:14, 15

When Jesus spoke of the world’s hatred for all who believe in Him, Jesus is not referring to the natural world, as in nature. Nor is our Lord referring to this earthly body and life. For all of these are gifts from God to be gratefully enjoyed. However, when the Bible speaks of the world with negative connotations, it’s referring to humanity’s sinful opposition to God. The world refers to those who live in unbelief, and the consequent rebellion of those who do not believe in Jesus or confess Jesus as their Lord. Because of the world’s love of evil, it collectively hates Christ and all who belong to Him through Baptism.

St. Paul warns that anyone who determines to live a righteous life in Christ will suffer the world’s anger and animosity. For the world is always inventing new ways of doing evil as its sinful passions and unholy desires wage war against God’s holy purposes and Christ’s holy people, the church. And so, when the Bible reviles the world, God’s Word is not condemning those things within the world of nature that God created as wholesome and good that are to be appreciated by Christians as gifts from God. Instead “the world” represents those parts of life where sinful humankind has distorted God’s gifts, denied that God is the giver of

these gifts, has desecrated God’s gifts by changing their usage, and has defiled God’s gifts by turning them into idols that people make more important than God.

Consider human sexuality. God created human sexuality as a gift to be shared between one man and one woman. Sex was given by God to strengthen the earthly bonds within the lifelong union of marriage. Yet the world has twisted the intention of this gift by separating the pleasure of sex from the covenant of marriage. Sexuality as it is practiced in the world today has been turned into something perverse and immoral, and not at all as God originally intended. The invention of the birth control pill along with the societal acceptance of abortion further separated sexual expression from marital fidelity. Sinners could now pursue sexual pleasure (adultery) without the former fear of pregnancy.

The first century world into which Christianity was born and thrived was very much like the world as we find it in the 21st century. Sexual immorality was as pervasive among the unbelieving world in the days after Pentecost as it is in our culture today. Pagan culture back then was as sexually explicit and as socially accepted as it has become in our day. Temple prostitution was even part of many pagan religions. Christians back then lived very differently from the world around them with regard to human sexuality. Christians really stood out in first century pagan culture because of their sexual modesty and abstinence outside of marriage. Christians stood out and apart from the world they lived in by living sexually pure and decent lives.

While there were surely individual sexually immoral lapses in this regard among Christians, (that could be forgiven), Christians made every attempt by the power of the Holy Spirit, to live sexual moral lives. The Christians showed the world a better way to live; even though they suffered antagonism from the world for living such righteous lives in Christ. Christians in the first century had a wholesome influence upon the world through their Christ-centered faith, life, practice, and example. Christians cannot hide from the world and expect to influence it. The monastic system already attempted this and failed to have any Christian influence upon the culture in medieval times.

And so the real question becomes, "Who is influencing whom? Is the church still having a godly influence upon our ungodly world? Or is the immorality of our world having an unwholesome influence upon the attitudes and actions of Christians? While there are certainly still those Christians who are having a positive impact upon the unbelieving world by their Christian faith and life, and by their witness to the Gospel not only in what they say but also in how they live; I fear that far too many Christians are being slowly swayed by the world. Recent opinion polls of Christians surveyed indicate that Christians are beginning to think more and more like the world on sexual issues. Sadly studies show that the vast majority of churchgoers don't behave any differently than those who don't attend church. What do you suppose this conveys to those who aren't Christians and don't attend church?

What accounts for the fact that Christians seem to be thinking and living more like the world around them than ever before? Why does Christianity seem less relevant to the dominant secular culture than in the past? For nearly two millennia Christians lived in the world without becoming like the world. What's changed? What's preventing Christians from being "salt" and "light" in the world today? Jesus once said, "If you abide in My Word, you are My disciples indeed." This is the biggest part of the problem. Most Christians are no longer biblically literate. They simply do not know what the Bible teaches and why! Christians are growing up to be lax and lazy about taking the time to learn what the Bible says. And churches are no longer teaching the Bible like they once did. Many churches (although they don't advertise it) no longer even believe that the Bible is God's inspired Word.

Without knowing God's Word and what it says, Christians are in grave danger of losing the true faith passed down to us by the apostles. Another concern is that many Christians have all the intentions of studying the Bible, but they never get around to it. Life has become so busy and complicated that Christians can find very little regular time to set aside to read God's Word. However, much of our time is filled up with things that are not nearly as important as reading the Word. The Bible says, "Seek first the kingdom of God and all the other things in life will follow." However we have all become so caught up in the cares and pleasures of the world, that remaining in the Word and close to Christ becomes a low priority whether we're willing to admit it or not.

The modern church and the modern churchgoer have become far too concerned about winning the world's acceptance and approval. And in the process are in danger of losing God's acceptance and approv-

al. And so congregations and Christians tend to remain silent on the tough issues where the world and the Word of God come into direct and heated conflict. Like the world Christians have become selfish instead of servant-hearted. Like the world, today Christians are too busy living for ourselves to be living for others. We've become too narcissistic to be philanthropic. Christians (like the world that is passing away under the wrath of God) have become too focused upon acquiring wealth than to be generous givers. And like the world we have become too lax ethically to remain the moral compasses for our corrupt culture.

The church is now okay with aberrant sexual behaviors and gender issues that just a generation ago Christians would've understood were sins to be avoided. Every time the world takes another moral step downward into the abyss of hell, Christians seem to want to tag along. This is not new for the world. The world has always lived as if there were no eternal consequences. But sadly Christians are now following the world, no longer having true fear and reverence for God. And even if we do stand our ground, the world wears us down. For the world never stops pushing its views upon us. It never stops until it has indoctrinated us to stand with the world in its opposition to God and to what God's Word teaches.

What is causing the church to become less and less distinguishable from the evil world that we live in? Churchgoers say they don't like long sermons. And yet they are naively quite willing for the world to preach to them by what they read in books, by what they watch on TV, and by what they are socially exposed to in everyday life. Other Christians fail to realize that you cannot change the world; for the world will forever remain hostile to God. You can only rescue people from the world by presenting the Gospel. And you can only repent to God for allowing the world to change you. We should not fear the world, nor should we run from it. Neither should we ignore it. For, we should be constantly aware of the spiritual dangers that this dark world poses to our faith. The Bible says that the way you overcome the world is by faith. When we believe, teach, and confess Christ and His teachings faithfully others will be able to see clearly that Christianity offers them a better way. When we live out our faith with great zeal and live our faith authentically we will regain credibility when others can see the clear contrast between following Christ versus following the world.

Camp Discovery: Jesus at Work through Us

This Year's Bible Stories

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego—These three men, by the grace of God, defy King Nebuchadnezzar's decree that all must worship the god he created. Thrown into the fiery furnace, they are rescued by God himself, who appears there in the furnace. God's name triumphs over all other names in all the world!

Healing of Bartimaeus—Described as a blind beggar, Bartimaeus utilized a messianic title in requesting help from Jesus. Responding to the faith given to the blind man that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus restored his sight and the Bartimaeus became his follower.

Ananias and Saul—God called Ananias to go to Saul to restore his sight. Not knowing of Saul's conversion, he expressed his concern over Saul. God revealed to Ananias that Saul was to be his chosen instrument to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all the Gentiles.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus!

May the peace of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, rest with you all.

Our congregation is not in very good shape financially. All of us need to remember our commitment to our Lord with blessings He has given to each of us. At our last Church Council meeting in April we did not have a quorum to meet, but it was reported at that time that the congregation is "in the red" \$81,268.73, meaning that we spent \$81,268.73 more than we received in offerings from January through April 2015.

Not only that but we've fallen short of our offerings for the last two years (or more), leaving a debt that we have had to pay out of our committed funds, but this has also depleted all of our reserve financial resources. We no longer have these funds to fall back on (to borrow from ourselves) as we have in the past. We have reached our limits and will now have to borrow from a bank if we are unable to meet our monthly expenses in the future.

If this pattern continues, it could have serious consequences on the mission of the congregation.

Please give prayerful consideration to increasing your Unified Fund offerings to your Lord here at St. John.
