All the Company of Heaven Never Alone

The holiday season is almost upon us. For the church, that season unofficially begins with the celebration of the Reformation on October 31st. The very next day, to kick off the month of November, is All Saints' Day. The early church had begun the practice of remembering important saints on the anniversary of their deaths. So as to not overlook the importance of all the saints, the church added the celebration of All Saints' Day, which came to be observed on November 1st.

All Saints' Day is most-commonly celebrated today as the day in which we remember all of the Christians who have died before us. On the Sunday we observe All Saints' Day (this year it will be on November 3rd), we follow the tradition of announcing the names of our church members who have died in the past year. This is a great way to give thanks and praise to our God for giving these saints faith through Baptism and the Lord's Supper and ushering them into the Church Triumphant through the gateway of death.

In the spirit of All Saints' Day, it is appropriate and beneficial to be reminded of the comfort we have as the Church Militant here on earth. We all have known the pain of losing a dear loved one. Life is never the same after they are gone. We are tempted by the

devil to think that life cannot possibly be as good anymore. We can be so overwhelmed by grief and sadness that life loses its luster and its joys are forgotten. While certainly understanding of our plight, the Lord does not want us to dwell in such sadness. After all, we have some very important truths given to us by our Lord Jesus Christ to temper our sadness with true joy.

One of those truths that is sadly overlooked and highly underemphasized is that which is stated in Hebrews 12. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." The great cloud of witnesses in Hebrews 12 no doubt includes all those Old Testament saints from Hebrews 11. They all believed the same thing we do, that God's promised Savior would come and be the sacrifice for our sin.

Included in that great cloud of witnesses are all of the other saints who are not so mentioned, but are in the presence of Christ all the same. They still worship the Lord Jesus Christ as we do. Faith in the one Lord Jesus Christ is what still unites us. We are given a glimpse of this in Revelation 7:9–17, where John speaks of seeing the innumerable host gathered around the throne of the Lamb, singing praise to him. As Christ Jesus is with us always, they are now with him always. Where the head is so is the body. Together, through the waters of Baptism, we are all members of the body of Christ. Where Christ is, there they are, and where Christ is, there we are too.

It is no accident that the words leading us into the singing of the Sanctus are these: "Therefore, with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify [Jesus'] glorious name, evermore praising you..." When we sing the words of the great *Sanctus*, we are joining with the holy angels and all the saints who have gone before us. Even more so, the saints of heaven join with us in the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Rev. Kenneth Wieting, in his book *The Blessings of Weekly Communion*, explains it in this way:

Christ and His saints are one spiritual body, a vital union even as the human body is joined with the head. This spiritual body includes the saints who have already departed this life in the faith. Christ is eternal, and His body cannot be divided by our limits of time...We are divided only by the narrow stream of death. We do not eat in isolation but as part of the church across space and time...When the Lord, the head of the church, comes into our midst, He does not do so in isolation from His body. Those who have died in Christ are always with Him, even when He comes to serve us (p. 200).

What comfort this great concept brings! The closest we can be to our loved ones who have departed in the faith is at the Lord's Supper! When we are at the rail, we join with all the saints, for they are where Christ is.

As Christians in this world, you are never alone. The Lord Jesus is always with you, as he promised. You are also surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, those who have confessed the same faith that you have, which has been given to you in Baptism. While you gather with your brothers and sisters in Christ each week at the communion rail, you are also joined by your brothers and sisters in Christ who are with him in his kingdom. That is truly a foretaste of the great feast to come, a beautiful glimpse of the Last Day, when Christ returns in glory and all the saints are raised from the dead and reunited forever!

The celebration of All Saints' Day is truly a remarkable one! I hope and pray you are able to join us for this great festival day, this year on November 3rd, and that you are blessed to remember that you are not alone, especially when you gather at the Lord's table with all of the Lord's blessed redeemed ones!

November Music Notes



Happy 500th Anniversary!

In the early years of the Reformation, Martin Luther expressed a desire that people should sing songs in their own language during worship. Since German hymns were lacking, he encouraged poets, clergy, and even a shoemaker to write new songs to fill the need. His encouragement began to bear fruit when the "Achtliederbuch" ("eight-hymn book"), officially titled Etlich Cristlich Lieder (Some Christian Hymns) was published in 1524. This first Lutheran hymnal celebrates its 500th anniversary this year.

Most of the eight hymns have fallen out of use, but three remain in *Lutheran Service Book*:

- 1. "Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice," LSB 556 (Nun freut euch, lieben Christen g'mein), by Martin Luther
- 2. "Salvation unto Us Has Come," LSB 555 (Es ist das Heil uns kommen her), by Paul Speratus
- 3. "From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee," LSB 607 (Aus tiefer Not schrei ich zu dir), by Martin Luther

On 11.10, 11.17 and 11.24 I will be playing organ pieces based on these three hymns.
