The Divine Service: The Benediction Beginning at the End

What thoughts come to your mind when you hear the words of the Benediction, the final blessing announced at the end of the service? "The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace. Amen" (Numbers 6:24–26). Each part begins with "The LORD," so that will be addressed first, and, in connection with that, the importance of the number three in the Benediction. What it means to blessed and kept by the LORD will follow. And, lastly, the lifting up the LORD's countenance and the giving of his peace will conclude the study.

God gave these words first to Moses to give to Aaron to speak to the people. Aaron was Israel's first high priest, the one called upon by God to act on his behalf in worship and to act on behalf of the people in worship. These words we know so well were given by God for Aaron to speak so that he could "bless the people of Israel" (Numbers 6:23). "Bless" would be recognized in the Hebrew as a special word spoken to a person. It would stand out and set them apart as something "holy" would be. And it all begins with God's name, as he announced it to Moses in Exodus 3: Yahweh.

Yahweh is the word spoken to Moses by God. Moses was to go to the Hebrew people in Egypt and tell them that their God was going to rescue them. Not sure to whom he should refer, Moses is told by God, "Tell the people that 'I AM' has sent me to you." God proceeds to call himself, "I am who I am," which is a translation of the four Hebrew letters YHWH. The name of God as many now pronounce it "Yahweh" is most often written as "LORD" in all capitalized letters. Whenever we see "LORD" in our Bibles, we can translate in our minds to the name of God, which is "Yahweh."

This is so important because it personalizes God. God has a name and he wants it used properly, as we hear him say in the Second Commandment: "You shall not misuse the name of Yahweh your God." This is also important because of Yahweh's intentions with these words: "So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them." The idea of marking or branding or sealing is not foreign to the Bible. The Hebrew people were marked with circumcision. Christians are marked and sealed in the waters of Baptism. Hebrew boys were given their name on the day of their circumcision, the eighth day after birth. Christians' names are clearly announced at their Baptism. And at both events, the name of Yahweh is placed upon the recipient (Colossians 3:11–14). Those who receive Yahweh's name belong to him and he belongs to them, with a permanent bond being established by God.

In the Benediction, the words first given for Aaron to speak, the statement is broken into three lines with two units belonging to each line. The name of Yahweh begins each of the three lines. Christians can recognize this as Trinitarian, and the Hebrew people would have had an understanding of this as well. Jesus would later attach each person of the Trinity to the name of Yahweh. "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Each person of the Holy Trinity is active in the blessing of the people, as each person is active in the creation, redemption, and sanctification of the people.

As stated earlier, the act of the LORD "blessing" sets the people apart as special. "And keep you" adds to Yahweh's act of securing for himself a people the act of protecting his people. God provides for all our needs of body and soul. He sends his holy angels to guard us and fight against the evil foe and his legion of fallen angels. Yahweh God is constantly busy keeping his people under his perfect care, a truth that gives us great comfort.

"The LORD make his face shine upon you." As the earth needs the radiance of the sun, so God's people need the radiance of his glory. To have God's face shining upon us means that we have his favor, that he loves us despite our sinfulness. "And be gracious to you" reemphasizes the undeserved love of God that he gives to us because he has given us his name. Where his name is placed, there his grace shall be as well.

"The LORD lift up his countenance upon you." The word for "countenance" in the Hebrew is the same word used before for "face." Here, Yahweh is strengthening his claim of favoring his people, not because of anything they have done, but because of his faithfulness to those who bear his name. "And give you peace." This is what God desires for all people. Our sin pits against God in all-out war (Ephesians 2). We cannot possibly win, and because God wants all people with him forever, he wins the war by sending his Son. Jesus Christ steps in as the new Adam, representing us all (1 Corinthians 15:20–23). He lives the perfect life in our place and then offers that life up to God as the perfect sacrifice. Jesus is crucified and dies so that we can have forgiveness. "By his wounds we are healed", Isaiah 53 says. Jesus is the bringer of peace with God.

That is why the sign of the cross is made when those final words are spoken. Jesus spoke the words "Peace to you" to his disciples and then showed them the marks of the cross (John 20:19–21). Jesus' death has granted peace between God and man. The Benediction that closes the Divine Service is the bookend that wraps us all up in the cross of Jesus. All the Scriptures, from beginning to end, are about Jesus and him crucified (Luke 24:27; John 20:30–31). The whole Divine Service, from beginning to end, is about Jesus and him crucified. That is the sacred name God places upon his people in the Benediction. Your whole life, then, from your Baptism until your death, is wrapped in the name of the Triune God, Yahweh, the Lord Jesus Christ.

What a powerful blessing God gives to you, his people, each and every time you hear those sacred words. You are blessed, for you belong to God, and his holy name is upon you forever.
